WATER QUALITY & TESTING:

Volunteers monitored five sites in Clear Lake seven times in 2007. Although there are no concerns with E.Coli, total Coliform or clarity, there **is a problem with Phosphorus!** A lake's phosphorus threshold is the concentration at which this nutrient may cause ecological imbalance. Below this threshold, the lake is "healthy".

Our lake is "over threshold" and needs immediate attention by all cottagers/stakeholders. WE URGENTLY NEED YOUR HELP TO RESTORE OUR LAKE TO ITS FORMER GRANDEUR!!

Leaving your natural shoreline intact (or if need be, replacing it with plant growth) and maintaining your septic tank and system in good working order are the most important actions that any of us can take towards protecting our lake. We can also avoid using chemical cleaners, mitigate erosion on our properties and at all costs, avoid using chemical or natural fertilizers.

We need EVERYONE to do their part or our lake will continue to deteriorate!!! Please review the following check points and ask yourself if you are doing your part.

- Ensure your septic system is functioning properly.
- Use Phosphate free laundry soap, dishwasher soap, shampoo, body soap and cleaning products. Not only environmentally sensitive but PHOSPHATE FREE!!
- DO NOT use fertilizers on lawns (chemical or natural)
- DO NOT remove shoreline vegetation, rather plant new vegetation
- DO plant shoreline plants to assist in maintaining the integrity of the shoreline that will benefit us, birds, fish, animals and ultimately the water quality
- The association asks for the co-operation of the wake boarders and skiers to use the middle of the lake rather than to go along the shore to minimize the wake action on shore. Shore erosion is becoming a serious problem and contributes to poor water quality.

GARBAGE:

Reminder that garbage day is Monday. Garbage is to go out on the morning of the garbage day, NOT the night before. Unless you have a METAL bin, which has a latch that you can fasten, animals will be able to get into your garbage.

Alternatively, drop it off at any of the landfill sites on Hwy. 11, south of Gravenhurst or the Transfer station at Eveleigh Road off #118, or in the municipal bins at Nine Mile Lake Marina. FISH:

Catch and release? - It depends. We are currently experiencing an excess of Rock Bass and Pike in the lake. The Pike tend to eat the smaller fish that are beneficial to the lake. Although we normally promote catch & release, please do not release the Pike or Rock Bass into the lake.

MARKER BUOYS:

Please have a visual knowledge of where the marker buoys normally are. They can move or break free during a storm, or if someone has tied up to them. Please do not tie up to the buoys on the shoal or on any other buoys on the lake.

LAUNCH RAMP:

Dr. MacBain continues to make his ramp available but please ask for permission, pick a reasonable time, and where possible, limit your use of the ramp to a single in and out for the season. Ensure your boat hull is clean and free from anything where you were last time.

Note: Clean and scrub the hull of your boat if you have been boating in other lakes. You should empty your bilge water and leave the boat out of water for a few days if possible. This will prevent Zebra Mussels and other undesired creatures from populating our lake
