Paul Trayes – lake markers

-Changes to the buoys in the lake this year – have used large sized boat bumpers in the past. The official markers are extremely expensive

-everyone will see new round buoys that are white now

-ANYONE WHO IS FISHING OR FLOATING- DO NOT TIE TO THE BUOY ROPES -marks, rope, and sand blocks donated came to \$450- and will hopefully last for 20 years

Water quality – Bob Cleverdon

-water testing program -see website for detailed information about the program -CONCERNS

-phosphorus is what will kill the lake and our rates are starting to improve but we are still above the threshold.

-we are also higher than more than half of the lakes participating in this program -District of Muskoka also does a test in the lake – their rates are slightly lower than ours but seeing the same slow improvement

-we also test for bacteria - and we are well below the standard. The e-coli rate is starting to rise and we need to keep watching this . (there was one high rate that brought the entire scale up)

Sharon and Bob Cleverdon will continue to do the testing and we all must take our part in keeping the lake clean.

Q- Is there anything available to clean a boat?
