CLEAR LAKE PUBLIC BOAT LAUNCH

The new concrete ramp is to be used only between 9am and 1pm. Before launching, please clean your boat, dump bilge water before arriving, and note location of boulders on shore. Because of the gravel shoulders on the ramp, it is not possible to install a floating dock. We recommend that you have two people to launch your boat. If you are not experienced in launching a boat without a dock, we recommend you have a professional do this for you.

Signs Regarding Boat Launch: Both 'Hours of Use' (9am to 1pm) and 'No Parking' signs are installed at the ramp. 'No Parking' signs are in place as far as 200 metres on either side of the boat launch.

MUSKOKA'S DARK NIGHT SKY

At the AGM July 8, Mike Silver will speak to this issue. His summary follows:

"The Clear Lake Association has supported the Torrance Barrens Dark Sky Reserve since its inception. Its continued viability and that of Muskoka's dark sky, less affected by light pollution, is under severe threat from the inaction of Gravenhurst and the District. We pay taxes to the District and the night sky is one of Muskoka's treasured assets and the Barrens Reserve an asset of which we on Clear Lake are the principal beneficiaries. We need to make our voices heard if there is to be any chance of preserving it. Gravenhurst and the District are flagrantly violating the Dark Sky Bylaw! This is all to countenance corporate greed without regard to night sky preservation.

"We need to act. We need to act now."

WATER QUALITY RESULTS FROM 2016 TESTING

Please see the results posted on our CLPOA Website, *www.clearlakemuskoka.ca*. Thank you, Bob and Sharon Cleverdon, for your time and effort collecting the lake water samples several times every season and submitting them to the Muskoka Lakes Association (MLA) Water Quality Initiative on our behalf. The cost for testing is approximately \$1,000 this year. With a \$30 discount for each CLPOA member who is also a member of MLA, it would benefit CLPOA if more of our members joined MLA.
